# Research Centers and Research profile areas

Research in more than 50 main areas is conducted, including differential equatations and optimal control, spectral theory of operators, stochastic integral geometry, boundary theorems of probability theory and analysis of stationary stochastic processes, algebra and topólogy, deformable body mechanics, theoretical mechanics, theoretical physics, quantum physics, physics of semiconductors and semiconductor devices, elaboration of new methods for synthesis of main organic substances, investigation of new highly efficient methods and devices for substance analysis, study of physical-chemical bases of biological systems, study of flora and fauna, problems of ecology, modern issues of Armenology and Armenian history and culture, theoretical philosophy, political institutions and processes, economic and socio-economic problems in transition period, and lot of others.

# Problems that exist (besides COVID-19)

- Need to further develop QA environment
- Need to in-depth study YSU alumni satisfaction with the education and correspondence of YSU curricula to the skills needed in labour market
- Addressing market needs

## **More Challenges**

- Funding (rather underfunding)
- Braindrain
- Keeping recent PhDs at YSU
- Keeping leadership positions
- Increased competition at domestic market
- Diversification and establishing new (interdisciplinary) programs

## **Further steps**

- YSU developed detailed procedures for QA and mechanisms for their implementation
- QA is aimed at further development of staff qualification, bringing it to internationally recognized standards
- QA involves permanent review of course curricula and syllabus content and assuring their correspondence to internationally recognized standards

## **Further steps**

- Need to bring teaching methodology to internationally recognized standards, further assurance of the existence of the student—centered education
- Teaching and learning environment development
- Bring research to the level corresponding to the international excellence
- Equipment development (scientific infrastructure)

# International Cooperation and Internationalization Policy

- Currently YSU has more than 265 cooperation agreements with foreign partners – universities, institutes and research centers in about 50 countries.
- Last year outgoing mobility: about 530, including more than 150 student mobilities
- More than 7000 foreign students from 82 countries studied at YSU
- Yerevan State University is a member of: International Association of Universities, European Universities Association, Eurasian Universities Association, Black Sea Universities Network, AUF
